When families first arrive at RMHC Toronto, they often feel scared and exhausted as they confront the challenge of their childs life-threatening illness. Because of you, they find a place like home where they can be together. Families regain a sense of normalcy and find moments of relief and even a bit of laughter at a time when their life has been turned upside down.

We wrapped our arms around 4,735 families at our House and seven Family Rooms last year. A new family with a seriously ill child arrived on one of our doorsteps about every 100 minutes.

In 2018, we launched a mobile app to supplement the face-to-face support and information families receive at the Front Desk of our House. Our Virtual Front Desk app won the top international award for innovation and impact on families from Ronald McDonald House Charities Global.

We also increased front-line staffing, expanded programming, upgraded our IT systems and infrastructure and streamlined processes to ensure we operate as effectively and efficiently as possible. It's important we give families our best and that we do so in a responsible manner as we optimize every dollar spent.

We are an independent charity, governed by a volunteer Board of Directors and operated by staff and volunteers. 
- o A House for 81 families in downtown Toronto

Our House

Ronald McDonald House provides compassionate hospitality and accommodation for families from across Canada and around the world seeking life-saving medical treatment for their children in Toronto

At Ronald McDonald House, families find a welcoming place to call home. Our House accommodates 81 families and provides first-class facilities thoughtfully designed to meet their needs. We are here for families 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. We never close.



Our Family Rooms

Our seven in-hospital RMHC Toronto Family Room® programs provide family members with a place to rest and recharge just steps away from where their sick child is being treated. Research shows this promotes their overall well-being, helping them cope better with the stress of their child's illness.

Each of our Family Rooms includes a TV lounge area, a kitchenette stocked with snacks and beverages and spaces for napping and sleeping.



Family Programs

RMHC Toronto offers more than 20 innovative programs in our House and Family Rooms to support the practical, emotional and learning needs of families. These programs provide a sense of normalcy during chaotic times.






